Anna Ortiz is Professor of Educational Leadership and Program Coordinator of the Student Development and Higher Education program at California State University – Long Beach, where she has served as a faculty member since 2002. Previously, Dr. Ortiz was an Assistant Professor for Higher, Adult, and Lifelong Education here at Michigan State University. With a Ph.D. in Higher Education and Organizational Change from UCLA, her teaching and research interests center around college student development, primarily in the areas of ethnic identity development, multicultural education, and professional issues in student affairs. Co-author of the recently published *The Ethnic Experience of College: Advancing Theory and Improving Diversity Practices on Campus*, she has publications in a variety of books and journals within higher education.

A professor and practitioner in the field for over 20 years, Dr. Ortiz has a passion for helping college and university students get the most out of their education and in helping faculty, administrators, and staff work the best to make that happen.

The Raines Colloquium honors the significant contributions of Emeritus Professor Max Raines to the department, the college, the university, and the field of student affairs in higher education. A national leader in the field, Dr. Raines was also a critical figure in creating a strong academic and professional foundation for MSU's nationally recognized programs in student affairs, adult education, and higher education.
