

Summer Research Development Fellowships (SRDF)

 $\circ$  Goals :

- Develop research skills & approaches
- Support early-stage doctoral students

## Summer Research Development Fellowships

#### • Eligibility:

- Full-time students, after first year
- Part time students, no more than 18 credits completed
- Not UDF students because their summer is already funded
- <u>Award:</u> \$7000 fellowship
- <u>Due:</u> Friday, January 17, 2025 AT NOON to the College (Qualtrics link in announcement & on webpage)
- <u>Selection process:</u>
  - Departments will be allocated a certain number of awards so that all departments have ~ the same rate of funded applications
  - Department faculty review & rate applications



## Summer Research Development Fellowships

#### • <u>Time</u>:


- 2 months full-time work
- Can be divided in various ways
- Can pro-rate the award (i.e. for 1 month, or 1.5 months)
- School Psych students' awards will be pro-rated to 1 month
- Other work/classes
  - Recipients can do other work and can take classes
- Whose research?
  - YOURS



# Fellowship flexibility

1 month of full-time work (so, a \$3500 award) can look like this:

Yellow = research, blue = other





## Summer Research Development Fellowship

#### Application consists of:

- Proposal (700 words max—words, not pages)
  - Name, year in program, mentor name, proposal word count (this material isn't included in the word count)
  - Proposed plan for research skill development
- Transcript (MSU grad coursework only)

## Summer Research Development Fellowship

#### Selection criteria are set by the department

Prior evaluators have considered to what degree...

- Proposal is well-written and well-organized
- Author demonstrates an understanding of the field and its direction
- Importance of skills/approaches in the field
- Development of skills/approaches likely to advance student's research significantly
- The scope of the proposal is appropriate
- The applicant's academic record is strong




## Summer Research Development Fellowship

#### Proposal writing tips:

- Read the proposal—what is it asking for?
- Read examples of successful proposals
- 700 words isn't much
- ORA advice:
  - Grant writing is a different genre
  - Condense intro & lit review
  - Make sure to include research plan & timeline

# Mentors – Q&A


- Who selects my mentor? You do!
- Does it have to be my advisor? No
- Does it have to be someone in the College of Education? Yes
- May I have more than one? Yes
- What should I look for in a mentor? Research fit (research skill/ literature), personal connection
- What does my mentor do? Help (re)shape the proposal, be a thought partner, check in on progress, read drafts and comment

# Disbursing "summer" funding

- Students can only receive fellowship funds during a semester they are enrolled
- Doctoral students are not normally enrolled in summer
- We will plan to initiate (start the payout of) SRDFs late in spring semester
- UNLESS a student has federal financial aid (federal loans)—LET US KNOW IF THIS IS YOUR SITUATION!
- Processing time-plan ahead

# How many awards?

- 2022, 35 students applied, 86% (30) were funded
- 2023, 40 students applied, 80% (32) were funded
- 2024, 53 students applied, 72% (38) were funded
